**LOCAL TOWN AND VILLAGE LEADERS TO SPEAK AT FREE PUBLIC FORUM ON
'THE GREENING OF THE SOUTH FORK: ONE YEAR LATER'
Monday, October 5, 7 p.m.**

As a follow-up to the "Greening of the South Fork" forum in April of 2008, a second free public program titled "The Greening of the South Fork: One Year Later," will be held on Monday, October 5, at 7 p.m., when seven East Hampton and Southampton town and village elected officials will speak on what has been done to encourage sustainability over the past year.

The forum, to be held at the Rogers Memorial Library, 91 Coopers Farm Road in Southampton, is co-sponsored by the library, GAIN (Green and Involved Now) and the League of Women Voters of the Hamptons.

Serving as panelists will be Suffolk County Legislator Jay Schneiderman, Town of East Hampton Supervisor William McGintee, Town of Southampton Councilwoman Nancy Graboski, Village of East Hampton Mayor Paul Rickenbach, Jr., Village of Southampton Mayor Mark Epley, Village of Sag Harbor Deputy Mayor Tiffany Scarlato, and Village of Sagaponack Mayor Donald Louchheim. Mayors of other local villages are also expected to attend.

Residents are invited to listen to what has been accomplished to date, ask questions about their concerns, and share information about their efforts at making their homes/businesses and lifestyles more sustainable as well.
