**LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS SPONSORS FREE SCREENING OF ‘THE LAST FIX,’
A DOCUMENTARY ON EAST END’S PIONEERING DRUG COURT
Monday, November 8 at 7 p.m. Westhampton Library**

Those who missed its premier at the “Hamptons Take Two Film Festival” last November at Sag Harbor’s Bay Street Theater will have a second chance to see a free film showing of “The Last Fix: An Addict’s Passage from Hell to Hope” on Monday, November 8 at 7 p.m. at the Westhampton Library, 7 Library Avenue in Westhampton Beach, in a program sponsored by the League of Women Voters of the Hamptons.

The 64-minute documentary chronicles the journey of three convicted East End drug offenders—a man, a woman and a teenager—who opt for a tough and pioneering East End drug court instead of prison.

The film was produced and directed by Jacqui Lofaro of Bridgehampton and the late Victor Teich of East Hampton, partners in Justice Productions, a documentary film company focused on issues of social justice. Earlier collaborations included “The Empty Chair: Death Penalty Yes or No,” which won the 2006 Thurgood Marshall Broadcast Journalism Award and debuted at the 2003 Hamptons International Film Festival, and its sequel “70 x 7: The Forgiveness Equation,” which screened at the Hamptons Take 2 Film Festival in 2008.

Present for a “Q and A” session after the screening will be the filmmaker as well as Southampton Town Justice Deborah Kooperstein, one of the presiding judges in the film.
